



**Ph.D. Research Assistantship**  
**Assessment of Market and Non-market Benefits of Agroforestry**

A Doctoral-level Graduate Research Assistant position is available at the Department of Forestry, University of Missouri. The selected candidate will engage in the comprehensive assessment of market, social and environmental benefits associated with the adoption of agroforestry practices. The selected candidate will work in close collaboration with personnel of the University of Missouri's Center for Agroforestry.

The Graduate Research Assistant will collaborate with her/his major professor in ongoing research efforts, interact with agroforestry sector stakeholders, present research findings at professional conferences, and prepare research manuscripts for peer-reviewed journals. The assistantship provides a competitive stipend, a full tuition waiver, and includes health insurance benefits. Funding is available for a three-year program.

The selected candidate will enroll in a Doctoral program majoring in Forestry. A multi-disciplinary coursework will include classes in Agroforestry, Agricultural and Resource Economics, and Policy. A qualified candidate should have a background in agriculture/forestry, agricultural economics, natural resources management, or closely related fields. Strong quantitative skills are highly recommended. A Masters degree is a necessary qualification to apply for this position.
